This Week, April 3 Tina Turley and Theater Tuscaloosa

Among Tuscaloosa's many cultural gems, its local theater scene, anchored by Theater Tuscaloosa, is among the most precious. And Theater Tuscsaloosa is no stranger to Tuscaloosa Rotarians – in fact the group has performed at Indian Hills in recent times. This week they return again, again under the able leadership of **Tina Turley**.

Turley (in cooperation with Shelton State Community College) has been the Executive Producer for Theatre Tuscaloosa since 2006. She has a diverse background in the arts and over 25 years experience as a director, actor, writer, teacher and theater manager. She has directed well over a hundred shows for over 15 theatres in the southwest. She has most recently directed *The Drowsy Chaperone* for Theatre Tuscaloosa,



and has directed other musicals there including Nunsense, The Sound of Music, The Music Man, and Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.

This week, Rotarians will be treated to live performances of selections from one of the Theater's current productions, *Smoke on the Mountain*. The musical comedy, to be shown April 18-22, is one of Theater Tuscaloosa's most requested shows by far, and has been staged repeatedly in recent years. It tells the story of a traditional church revival set at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church in North Carolina in 1938

"Our previous productions of *Smoke* were directed by Paul Crook," says Turley. "Together with our cast, Paul laid a strong foundation for the work we're doing now. Most of the cast from our 2007 production is back with the addition of Wheeler Kincaid in the role of Dennis."

Last Week, March 27: Honda's Mark Morrison on Automaking and Economic Recovery in Alabama

The numbers are impressive enough. Honda Manufacturing of Alabama in Lincoln employs some 4,000 workers and is responsible for the produciton of four leading models, as well as every Honday V-6 engine sold worldwide. The company spends some \$2 Billion annually in our state, with an overall economic impact estimated at around \$4 Billion.



But what makes the company strongest of all, says Mark Morrison, is its people. Morrison is Manager for Corporate Affairs and Communication for HMA. He visited Rotary last Tuesday to speak more about the company.


Morrison told how recent turns of events had challenged the company, from the recession of 2008-08 to the tsunami in Japan to the April, 2011 storms. At one point the plant in Lincoln was simply shut down. There were no chips for the cars coming from Japan, and therefore nothing to produce. For some 45 days the plant and its people kept busy with other tasks such as training and retoooling.

Then, in the wake of the April storms, despite mounting losses of revenue and market share, the Honda team united (and worked out countless legal and logistical details) and took to the streets to aid in cleanup and rebuilding. In the midst of crisis and loss, Honda's people put others first.

The company has receovered nicely of late and is returning to its usual annual production capacity of around 300,000 vehicles and engines.

Morrison received a journalism degree from the University of Alabama in 1986. Prior to joining Honda, he worked in corporate communications and marketing in Atlanta, Montgomery and Tuscaloosa. He is also a former newspaper reporter.
