

Whit Gibbons

Herpetologist, author



Whit Gibbons is a retired professor of ecology from the University of Georgia and former head of the Environmental Outreach and Education program at the Savannah River Ecology Laboratory.

Gibbons graduated from Tuscaloosa High School in 1957 and received degrees in biology from the University of Alabama (B.S.-1961; M.S.-1963) and zoology from Michigan State University (Ph.D. - 1967).

He is the author or editor of 20 books on herpetology and ecology,

has published more than 250 articles in scientific journals, has had commentaries on National Public Radio (Living on Earth, Science Friday, and others) and has written more than 1,000 popular articles on ecology published in magazines and newspapers, including a weekly, nationally syndicated newspaper column that has appeared in The Tuscaloosa News for more than 30 years.

His encyclopedia articles have appeared in World Book, Compton's, and for 30 years included the annual summary of Zoology for the Encyclopedia Britannica Year Book. He wrote the merit

badge booklet, Reptile and Amphibian Study, for the Boy Scouts of America.

Gibbons has received the Henry S. Fitch Award for Excellence in Herpetology and the Distinguished Herpetologist Award at the national/international Joint Meetings of Ichthyologists and Herpetologists for long-term excellence in the study of amphibian and reptile biology. He was awarded the IUCN Behler Turtle Conservation Award in recognition of long-term turtle research and conservation nationally and internationally, and received the National Meritorious Teaching Award in Herpetology.

This Week in History

The "Today" show, the first morning news/talk program, premiered on Jan. 14, 1952; led by Bart Starr, the Green Bay Packers defeated the Kansas City Chiefs, 35-10, on Jan. 15, 1967, in the first Super Bowl (though it wasn't called that until a couple of years later); the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified on Jan. 16, 1919, and took effect on Jan. 17, 1920, ushering in the era of Prohibition; Edgar Allan Poe was born on Jan. 19, 1809.
