



Earl Tilford

Herpetologist, author



Earl Tilford holds a B.A. and M.A. in history from the University of Alabama and a Ph.D. in American and European military history and Soviet/East European politics from George Washington University.

After retiring from the Air Force in 1993 after 23 years as an intelligence officer, he served as director of research for the U.S. Army's Strategic Studies Institute, heading a team tasked with looking 25 years into the future to determine strategic threats

and recommending strategies to deal with those threats.

In 2001, he left government service to accept a professorship at Grove City College, a small liberal arts college in Pennsylvania where he taught courses in U.S. military history, modern Russian history, U.S. national security, World Wars I and II, the Vietnam War, international and domestic terrorism and counter-terrorism and other subjects.

In 2008, he returned to Tuscaloosa to research and write "Turning the Tide: The University of Alabama in the 1960s," which was published by the University of Alabama Press last year.

The Iran Hostage Crisis ended after 444 days on Jan. 20, 1981; President Jimmy Carter granted unconditional pardons on Jan. 21, 1977, to hundreds of thousands of men who dodged the draft during the Vietnam War; Wham-O produced the first Frisbees on Jan. 23, 1957; the U.S.S. Pueblo, a Navy intelligence vessel, was captured in the Sea of Japan near North Korea on Jan. 23, 1968; the first canned beer debuted on Jan. 24, 1935 in Richmond, Va.; JFK held the first televised presidential news conference on Jan. 25, 1961.
