

Dana Duckworth

University of Alabama gymnastics coach



Dana Duckworth is in her first year as head coach of the University of Alabama gymnastics team, succeeding long-time coach Sarah Patterson.

Duckworth came to UA from Sterling Heights, Mich., as a 17-year-old student-athlete in 1990. She was recruited to the gymnastics team by Patterson and went on to become a two-time individual national and SEC champion in balance beam, a four-year All-American and a member of UA's 1991 national championship team. She also earned Academic All-

America honors.

She graduated with a bachelor's degree in telecommunications and film and, after a stint in the business world, entered graduate school at UA, taking advantage of the NCAA and SEC Postgraduate Scholarships she had won. She was awarded her master of business administration degree in 1998.

Duckworth then spent nearly a decade with Pfizer Pharmaceuticals, while also serving as a volunteer assistant under Patterson from 2001-2008. She became a full-time assistant coach for the

Abraham Lincoln signs Ulysses S. Grant's commission to command the U.S. Army on March 10, 1864; Lawrence Welk is born on March 11, 1903; FDR gives his first "fireside chat" on March 12, 1933; the Quartermaster Corps of the United States Army begins training dogs for the newly established War Dog Program, or "K-9 Corps," on March 13, 1942; Albert Einstein is born on March 14, 1879; President Lyndon B. Tuscaloosa County Sheriff Ron Abernathy, who took office in January, updated the club on the sheriff's department, including advances in technology. The department recently put out a smart phone app that can be used to access information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The app will enable citizens to assist in locating perpetrators of crimes in our county as anyone can take a picture on the app and send it directly to the sheriff's department. Abernathy also suggested residents use hunting, or game, cameras to safeguard their homes. And the sheriff said he has reinstated the inmate labor program to help the county save money. The program assists with litter clean-up, beautification and repair of area schools and other tasks.
