

# Last Week — March 29, 2016

Lydia Ellington Joffray, director of the Gorgas House Museum at the University of Alabama, recounted the history of the house, which was the first structure built on campus, and the Gorgas family. Built in 1829, the house has had many uses over the years, including dining hall, hotel, infirmary, post office, steward's residence, classroom space and faculty residence. It is one of four structures that survived the Union Army's burning of the campus in 1865. The university reopened in 1871 and the house was occupied by the Gorgas family, who served UA as librarians, from 1879-1953. The Gorgas House opened as a museum in 1954.
