

When Jimmy Osborn was born with cerebral palsy, his doctors told his mother that she should commit him to an institution as he would never have a good quality of life. She did not and Jimmy has defied the odds to have a very successful life. He serves on the board of United Cerebral Palsy (UCP) and worked to build a playground in the Tuscaloosa area for kids with all abilities to use, including swings for kids in wheelchairs. He also works to put together the West Alabama Fair for UCP at Sokol Park each year; the funds raised go back to UCP programs. Jimmy collects new and used wheelchairs, as well, so that he may help people in need of a wheelchair who may not be able to afford them on a normal basis receive the wheelchair that they need to live. One of his other current projects includes setting

up a computer lab at a children's home in Honduras. Jimmy is a wonderful example of "where there's a will, there's a way."
