John Merrill

Alabama Secretary of State



Alabama Secretary of State John Merrill is a native of Wedowee and grew up in Heflin before going on to graduate from the University of Alabama, where he was Student Government Association president in 1986-1987.

After stints with the Chamber of Commerce of West Alabama and the Tuscaloosa County Industrial Development Authority, he became director of Community Relations and Community Education for the Tuscaloosa County Board of Education, a position he held from 1994-2010.

In November 2010, Merrill was elected to the Alabama House of Representatives from District 62, which encompasses southeast Tuscaloosa County, winning 87 percent of the vote. During his term in the House, he served as secretary/treasurer of the Republican Caucus and was a member of the powerful Rules Committee, as well as the Economic Development and Tourism and Constitution, Campaigns, and Elections committees.

He was elected Alabama's 53rd secretary of state on Nov. 4, 2014

This Week in History

The U.S. postal system is established on July 26, 1775, with Benjamin Franklin as first postmaster general; on July 27, 1974, the House Judiciary Committee recommends that Richard Nixon be impeached and removed from office; Congress passes legislation establishing NASA on July 29, 1958; LBJ signs Medicare into law on July 30, 1965; Jimmy Hoffa disappears in Detroit on July 31, 1975; Charles Whitman goes on a shooting rampage at the University of Texas, killing 16 people and wounding more than 30.

Last Week — July 21, 2015

Dr. Guy Caldwell, professor of biological sciences and Distinguished Research Professor at the University of Alabama, discussed his research, which involves finding cures for neurodegenerative diseases. Dr. Caldwell began by recognizing the importance of Rotary's efforts to eradicate polio. His grandfather, Dr.

Guy A. Caldwell, M.D., was interested in the disease and was one of the physicians who attended FDR. His grandfather also was instrumental in founding the Ochsner Clinic and the Shriners Hospital for Children. His grandfather's work is what influenced Dr. Caldwell to enter a field where he could make a difference in disease research.
