### The Hon. Walt Maddox

Mayor of Tuscaloosa



Walter Maddox was sworn in for his third term as Tuscaloosa's 36th mayor on Nov. 4, 2013. Since his first inauguration, Maddox has led initiatives to increase economic development, improve customer service with the implementation of Tuscaloosa 311 and provide quality pre-k education for academically at-risk four-year old children.

Maddox has been nationally recognized for his crisis management following April 27, 2011, when an EF-4 tornado destroyed 12 percent of the city and severely damaged or de-

stroyed 5,300 homes and businesses. He is currently a fellow with the Program on Crisis Leadership at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government, and in 2012 was named Municipal Leader of the Year by American City and County (the publication for state and local governments).

A Tuscaloosa native, Maddox graduated from Central High School and earned his bachelor's degree in political science and master's degree in public administration from UAB. While at UAB, he was a four-year letter-winner on the football team.

### Last Week — July 28, 2015

Alabama Secretary of State John Merrill outlined some of the steps he has taken to improve the operation of his department since taking office in January. Those steps include ensuring that all employees are performing as expected, upgrading computers and other equipment and making sure the office is more diverse. He also ordered the first audit of the department in six years and plans to implement changes to improve voter registration. His steps to improve efficiency have already saved taxpayers \$866,117, he said.
