Last Week — August 4, 2015

Tuscaloosa Mayor Walt Maddox spoke on how the city will use part of the money from the reallocation of city and county sales tax revenue to address transportation infrastructure issues, particularly major projects on Alabama Highway 69, McWright's Ferry Road, McFarland Boulevard and Jack Warner Parkway that will improve traffic flow throughout the city. He also said the city's financial health is strong, but that one concern he would like to see addressed is the sales tax loophole for online purchases. The loophole puts local businesses at a disadvantage, he said. Maddox praised the city's police department, as well, for the way it handled a recent arrest in which a suspect died in custody. He said the city is lucky to have Chief Steve Anderson in charge of the police department.
