This Week in History

President William McKinley is shot by an anarchist in Buffalo, N.Y., on Sept. 6, 1901, and dies eight days later; President Jimmy Carter and Panamanian dictator Omar Torrijos sign a treaty on Sept. 7, 1977, transferring control of the Panama Canal from the United States to Panama at the end of the 20th century; on Sept. 8, 1974, President Gerald Ford pardons Richard Nixon for any crimes he may have committed or participated in while in office; California becomes the 31st state on Sept. 9, 1850; a Tunisian immigrant in France becomes the last person executed by guillotine, on Sept. 10, 1977; Islamic terrorists use hijacked jet airliners to attack America on Sept. 11, 2001, killing more than 3,000 people.

Last Week — September 1, 2015

Dr. Samuel N. Addy, director of the University of Alabama Center for Business and Economic Research, delivered the Alabama Economic Scorecard to the club. The state economy and the national economy are in good shape according to Dr. Addy's research, although he acknowledged that Alabama could be doing a little better. Since July, the state has added 106,000 jobs, continuing an eight-month trend of decreasing unemployment, but still needs to add about 80,000 jobs to get back to where it was prior to December 2007. The CBER expects the 2016 forecast for the state to be about the same as it has been in 2015.
