

### Richard M. Myers, Ph.D

President, Science Director of the HudsonAlpha Institute



Dr. Richard M. Myers, whose parents founded Tuscaloosa-based Jim Myers Drug, is president and science director of the non-profit HudsonAlpha Institute for Biotechnology in Huntsville.

The HudsonAlpha Institute was created in 2008 with a mission to use biotechnology to improve human health through genomic research, stimulate economic development and inspire young people to seek careers in science.

A Selma native, Myers came to the Institute with 35 years' experience in genetics and genomics and previously directed the Stanford Human Genome Center, one of the first U.S. human genome centers, pioneering the next-generation sequencing techniques that are elemental to the field today.

In addition to his role as president and science director, Myers continues to conduct research using genomics tools and genetics to understand how genes interacting with the environment contribute to human diseases and other traits.

The HudsonAlpha Institute is the cornerstone of the 152-acre Biotech Campus of Cummings Research Park, the second largest research park in the United States and the fourth largest in the world. The non-profit institute is housed in a state-of-the-art,
