### **Charles Karr**

Dean of the College of Engineering University of Alabama



Dr. Charles L. "Chuck" Karr has been dean of the University of Alabama's College of Engineering since July 2005.

Karr, a native of Gulf Breeze, Fla., is a three-time graduate of UA, completing his bachelor of science degree in mechanical engineering in 1984 and his master's and doctorate degrees in engineering mechanics in 1987 and 1989, respectively.

After receiving his doctorate, he spent seven years working as a research engineer with the U.S. Bureau of Mines, Tuscaloosa Research Cen-

ter. He joined the UA faculty in 1995 and was head of the aerospace engineering and mechanics department before becoming associate dean for research and graduate studies in 2004.

Considered a leading expert in the area of intelligent systems, Karr is the author of three books and 20 book chapters, and he has published 44 refereed journal articles and more than 90 conference papers. He has become widely known for his pioneering work in combining genetic algorithms and fuzzy logic, and he has successfully applied these techniques in the aerospace,

mineral processing, manufacturing and steel industries. In addition, he holds four international patents in the area of intelligent systems for locating the sources of radio signals.



### This Week in History

Ted Williams gets six hits in eight at-bats in a doubleheader on Sept. 28, 1941, to finish with a .406 average, making him the last Major League player to bat at .400 or better for a season; Adolf Hitler, Benito Mussolini, French Premier Edouard Daladier, and British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain sign the Munich Pact on Sept. 30, 1939, leading Chamberlain to declare "peace in our time"; Ford Motor Co. unveils the Model T on Oct. 1, 1908; Thurgood Marshall is sworn in as the first black justice of the U.S. Supreme Court on Oct. 2, 1967; East and West Germany reunite on Oct. 3, 1990, after being divided since the end of World War II.
