

# Last Week — September 23, 2014

Dr. Scot Duncan gave a synopsis of his book, "Southern Wonder: Alabama's Surprising Biodiversity," which explores Alabama's status as one of the most ecologically diverse states in the nation.

Duncan, an associate professor of biology and urban environmental studies at Birmingham-Southern College, said Alabama ranks fifth in number of species behind California, Texas, Arizona and New Mexico, largely because of the state's climate and geological diversity.

Unfortunately, the state ranks second in number of extinctions. Pollution and climate change contribute to this ranking, he said, but Forever Wild and other state programs are helping to protect and restore endangered flora and fauna, as well as educate Alabamians in ways to care for the environment.
