

Retired FBI agent and author Jack Owens, a graduate of the University of Alabama School of Law, spoke on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, which was the subject of his debut novel, "Watchman: JFK's Last Ride," published in October 2013. Owens said the evidence shows that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone but that enough mistakes were made following the assassination to give rise to conspiracy theories.

Owens' memoir of three decades in the trenches of the FBI, "Don't Shoot! We're Republicans!," was published in August 2009 and three novels in the "Pock Series," dark comedies about a serial killer and law enforcement in Alabama, are scheduled for publica-

tion. His books are available on his website, jackowensbooks.com.
