

# This Week — December 16, 2014 **Dwight McDaniel**

Retired FBI agent



This week's speaker is Dwight Mc-Daniel, who retired last year after a 30-year career with the FBI that included extensive undercover experience.

McDaniel grew up in Tuscaloosa and graduated from the University of Alabama and the UA School of Law.

He began his FBI career in Kansas City, Mo., in 1983 working foreign counter-intelligence, narcotics, organized crime and terrorism. In 1986, he transferred to New York City, where he worked undercover on the same types of cases. That experience led to his as-

signment as a special agent for the Treasury Department's U.S. Customs Service in Alabama for 16 years, which included managing one of the government's most successful undercover operations. The operation led to the arrest of more than 400 members of organized crime and a major narcotics and money laundering cartel.

In 2006, he was named the assistant special agent in charge for Department of Homeland Security Immigration and Customs Enforcement for the state of Alabama, overseeing major undercover investigations that involved international narcot-

JANUARY 6 Andrea Mayfield President, Shelton State Community College ics and money laundering operations and infiltrating a major child pornography ring that resulted in more than 5,000 arrest leads nationwide. After three years in that role, he transferred to the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Glynco, Ga., where he was in charge of training for the DHS Office of Investigations, which included training more than 1,200 students annually.

During his tenure, he received numerous awards including more than 30 Superior Performance/Special Act Awards for significant investigations and DHS's highest award, the Gold Medal Award.

On Dec. 16, 1773, Massachusetts colonists disguised as Mohawk Indians boarded three British tea ships and dump 342 chests of tea into Boston Harbor in the midnight raid that became known as the Boston Tea Party; Near Kitty Hawk, N.C., brothers Orville and Wilbur Wright made the first successful flight of a self-propelled, heavier-than-air aircraft on Dec. 17, 1903; The Mayflower docked at Plymouth Harbor on Dec. 18, 1620; President Bill Clinton was impeached on Dec. 19, 1998.
